## A BILL

To require a background check for every firearm sale.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Background Check Ex-
- 5 pansion Act".

## 6 SEC. 2. FIREARMS TRANSFERS.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 922 of title 18, United
8 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol9 lowing:

"(aa)(1)(A) It shall be unlawful for any person who
is not a licensed importer, licensed manufacturer, or licensed dealer to transfer a firearm to any other person

1 who is not so licensed, unless a licensed importer, licensed
2 manufacturer, or licensed dealer has first taken possession
3 of the firearm for the purpose of complying with sub4 section (t).

5 "(B) Upon taking possession of a firearm under sub-6 paragraph (A), a licensee shall comply with all require-7 ments of this chapter as if the licensee were transferring 8 the firearm from the inventory of the licensee to the unli-9 censed transferee.

10 "(C) If a transfer of a firearm described in subparagraph (A) will not be completed for any reason after a 11 licensee takes possession of the firearm (including because 12 13 the transfer of the firearm to, or receipt of the firearm by, the transferee would violate this chapter), the return 14 15 of the firearm to the transferor by the licensee shall not constitute the transfer of a firearm for purposes of this 16 17 chapter.

18 "(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to—

"(A) a law enforcement agency or any law enforcement officer, armed private security professional, or member of the armed forces, to the extent
the officer, professional, or member is acting within
the course and scope of employment and official duties;

1 "(B) a transfer that is a loan or bona fide gift 2 between spouses, between domestic partners, be-3 tween parents and their children, including step-par-4 ents and their step-children, between siblings, be-5 tween aunts or uncles and their nieces or nephews, 6 or between grandparents and their grandchildren; 7 "(C) a transfer to an executor, administrator, 8 trustee, or personal representative of an estate or a 9 trust that occurs by operation of law upon the death 10 of another person; 11 "(D) a temporary transfer that is necessary to 12 prevent imminent death or great bodily harm, in-13 cluding harm to self, family, household members, or 14 others, if the possession by the transferee lasts only 15 as long as immediately necessary to prevent the im-

16 minent death or great bodily harm, including the
17 harm of domestic violence, dating partner violence,
18 sexual assault, stalking, and domestic abuse;

"(E) a transfer that is approved by the Attorney General under section 5812 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986; or

"(F) a temporary transfer if the transferor has
no reason to believe that the transferee will use or
intends to use the firearm in a crime or is prohibited
from possessing firearms under State or Federal

with this notice on a form prescribed by the Attorney Gen eral.".

3 (b) AMENDMENT TO SECTION 924(a).—Section
4 924(a)(5) of title 18, United States Code, is amended by
5 striking "(s) or (t)" and inserting "(s), (t), or (aa)".

6 (c) RULES OF INTERPRETATION.—Nothing in this
7 Act, or any amendment made by this Act, shall be con8 strued to—

9 (1) authorize the establishment, directly or indi10 rectly, of a national firearms registry; or

(2) interfere with the authority of a State,
under section 927 of title 18, United States Code,
to enact a law on the same subject matter as this
Act.

15 (d) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
16 subsections (a) and (b) shall take effect 180 days after
17 the date of enactment of this Act.
